Soon we will have green grass, the crocuses will be blooming and it will be time once again to join your colleagues at the annual Michigan Psychiatric Society Spring Meeting. Join us April Friday April 21, 2017 at the Morris Lawrence Center at Washtenaw Community College.

Our meeting is one you won't want to miss! Approved for up to six hours of CME this year we have assembled a distinguished faculty presenting topics of interest in today's environment, including autism both in children and transition age, ADHD in adults, behavioral disturbances in dementia and risk assessment for violence in today's "armed" environment.

Our keynote speaker Phillip Resnick, MD will present **Risk Assessment for Violence in a Land of Guns**. Dr. Resnick is internationally recognized in his field and currently serves as a Professor of Psychiatry and Director, Division of Forensic Psychiatry at Case School of Medicine in Cleveland Ohio. Dr. Resnick will provide a practical map through the marshy minefield of uncertainty in risk assessment for violence. Attendees will have the opportunity to develop a violence prevention plan based upon their risk assessment.

Anthony Rostain, MD, MA joins us from the University of Pennsylvania where he is a professor of psychiatry and pediatrics. He is a Past President, American Professional Society for ADHD and Related Disorders (APSARD) and the co-author of Co-Author, "The Adult ADHD Tool Kit: Using CBT to Facilitate Coping Inside and Out," & "Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy for Adult ADHD: An Integrative Psychosocial and Medical Approach". He will be speaking on **Adults with ADHD: Current Approaches to Diagnosis and Treatment**. Attendees will review the hallmark features of ADHD in adults and key steps involved in assessing adults for ADHD, especially those who are being treated for other conditions such as anxiety and depression.

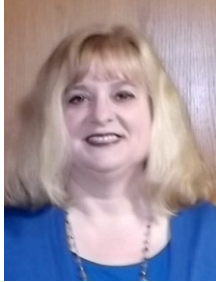
Psychiatrists today face challenging issues in treating their patients from cradle to grave. Children diagnosed with ADHD and autism spectrum disorder face challenges as they grow, mature and transition into adulthood. **Update on the Diagnosis and Management of Autism Spectrum Disorders in Children** presented by Kelly M. Gentile, MD will enlighten the attendees on the most current tools for diagnosis and management of these disorders as patients age.

Behavioral Disturbances in Dementia: A Practical Primer for the Busy Practitioner presented by Mary Blazek, MD reminds us that 95% of people with dementia will experience behavioral or psychologic symptoms of dementia (BPSD) at some point during the course of illness. Dr. Blazek will discuss different therapies including non-pharmacologic interventions

during her presentation.

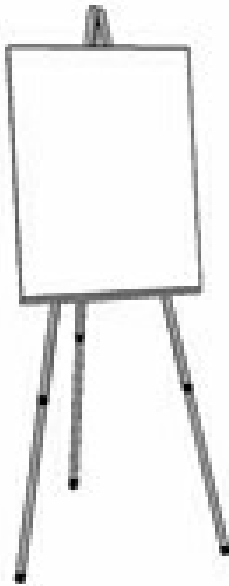
